2020 ANNUAL REPORT JULY 1, 2019 - JUNE 30, 2020

At Eva's Village, nutritious food and safe shelter open pathways to treatment for substance use and mental health disorders. Services for on-site medical and dental healthcare, childcare, job coaching and career training support progress towards stability and independence. Eva's Village helped over 143,000 men, women, and children move towards stability and independence last year.

TREATMENT + RECOVERY SUPPORT for Substance Use Disorders

Halfway Houses & Outpatient Recovery Treatment

Residential and outpatient treatment programs integrate behavioral, mental health, and medical care. Counselors help clients connect to social service programs.

Maternal Wraparound Program

Outreach, case management and on-going recovery support are provided for pregnant women struggling with opioid addiction.

Halfway House for Women & Children (Mommy & Me at Hope Residence) Mothers in recovery live with and care for their children, while they heal together as a family.

Recovery Community Center

Trained Recovery Coaches provide one-on-one support to individuals recovering from substance use disorders. Daily workshops and support groups are open to the community.

Medical & Dental Clinic

Residential clients receive primary medical and dental care. Our pediatric dental program serves children living at Eva's and others in the community.

Opioid Overdose Recovery Program (OORP)

Eva's peer Recovery Specialists connect **opioid overdose survivors** in hospital emergency rooms with recovery treatment and services.

patient visits logged by our Medical & Dental Clinic for residential clients who received routine health and dental care, treatment for chronic conditions, and Medication Assisted Treatment.



637

individuals with substance use disorders met Eva's Recovery Specialists in hospital emergency rooms, where they were connected to support and treatment at Eva's or referred to other care providers in the community.

JOB READINESS + TRAINING; CHILDCARE + ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Culinary School

provides private vocational training & job placement for Eva's clients and alumni and community members, with full financial aid for those in need.

Workforce Development

assists residential clients with resumes, job searches, and interview skills.

Childcare & After-School Care

offers educational activities and a supportive environment for infants, toddlers, and school-aged children of parents living in our Halfway House programs.

COMMUNITY MEALS + SUPPORTIVE HOUSING

Community Kitchen prepares **daily nutritious meals** for food-insecure guests and three meals/day for Eva's residents.

Shelters for Men & Women provide **emergency shelter** and supportive services for unsheltered individuals.

Family Shelter offers a **safe haven and support** for parents experiencing homelessness and their children.

Transitional Housing provides **apartments for mothers with children** enrolled in our recovery programs, who are working

towards permanent housing and independence.

Eva's Village Apartments offer **50 units of affordable, permanent housing** with on-site supportive services for eligible residents.

volunteers contributed over 30,000 hours, serving meals in our Community Kitchen and assisting with other programs throughout Eva's Village.

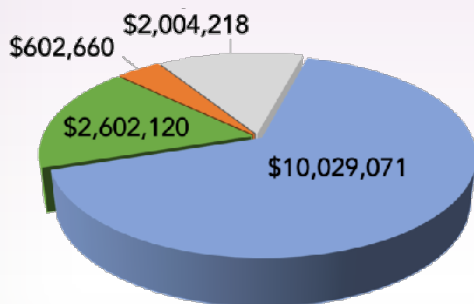
FY 2020 Expenses & Revenue - July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020

Eva's Village is a trusted partner funded by three main sources:

- **Private Donations** make up the largest share—*thirty-seven percent*—of our revenue. We receive generous support from individuals; private foundations; corporations; religious and civic organizations.
- **Fee-for-Service**—We bill for clinical services through Medicaid and other State of New Jersey initiatives.
- **Government Grants**—We partner with the State of New Jersey, Passaic County, and the City of Paterson to deliver contracted services.

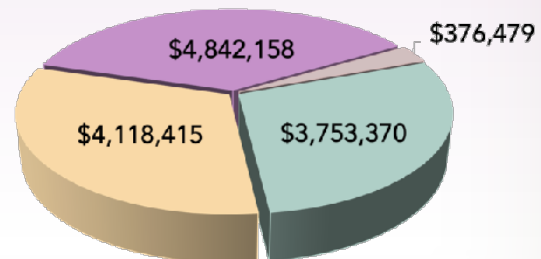
We spend only thirteen percent of our budget for administration and fundraising, ensuring that your donations go where they are needed most, to deliver vital care and support to the men, women, and children who rely on us for help and hope.
